Introduction to becoming an educational supervisor

- An introductory course that will equip attendees with some educational theory, an understanding of educator knowledge and skills requirements and an introduction work-based assessment (WBAs)
- Clinicians working in primary and community care environment from the wider workforce professions
- GPs who wish to explore how to support their learners better without committing to becoming a GP Trainer
- Recommended Introduction to Clinical Supervision or equivalent course and/or experience as a clinical supervisor



Introduction to becoming an educational supervisor

The aims of the course are:

- ✓ To appreciate the different forms supervision can take
- ✓ To understand different adult learning theories
- ✓ To understand the roles and responsibilities of an educational supervisor
- ✓ To have a high-level appreciation of different Work Based Assessments



Education supervisor pathway

A multi-professional course which provides the background knowledge and skills required to be an effective educational supervisor, suitable for:

- First Contact Practitioners/ACP/GP trainees/NMP/pre and post grad nurses and AHPs.
- ➤ Clinicians working in primary and community care environment from the wider workforce professions. Reduce the burden on senior nurses.
- > GPs who wish to become GP Trainers / Clinical Supervisors
- > Recommended Introduction to Educational supervision

Education supervisor pathway

The aims of the pathway are:

- ✓ To know how to ensure safe and affective patient care through training.
- ✓ To establish and maintain an environment for learning
- ✓ To be able to teach and facilitate learning
- ✓ To appreciate how to enhance learning via assessment
- ✓ To support and monitor educational progress
- ✓ To be able to guide personal and professional development
- ✓ To support CPD as an educator

Community of Practice Maintaining Educator knowledge, skills and behaviours

- > Support and provide access to educator learning and development
- ➤ Maintain, and refresh educator capabilities through ongoing CPD activities
- > Promote the role of educator within individual learning areas/environments
- > Include ongoing development as an educator in appraisal action plan/objectives

To summarise supervisors should:-

- ✓ Promote and ensure safe and effective patient care through robust work-based education
- ✓ Establish and maintain an environment for learning
- ✓ Be able to teach and facilitate learning
- ✓ Appreciate how to enhance learning via work-based assessment and have the skills to do this successfully
- ✓ Support and monitor educational progress
- ✓ Be able to guide personal and professional development
- ✓ Have access to Continual Professional Development as an educator
